Communications Revised 3/10/09

This plan shall mesh in all aspects with the Regional ESF 4 Plan, and especially the Regional ESF 2 Plan. This plan shall mesh in all aspects with the Statewide Fire-Rescue Disaster Plan.

Communications Personnel

Scene Communications Officer shall be appointed by Command.

Said individual shall coordinate the use of all radio frequencies by fireground personnel.

A Dedicated Dispatcher shall be assigned to the incident by the responsible dispatch center

Said individual shall handle only the incident

Other Dispatchers shall handle all other ongoing and routine dispatching business

A Communications Manager shall assigned by the responsible dispatch center

Said individual shall monitor operations within the dispatch center.

He/she shall coordinate with the Scene Communications Officer to assure the efficient use of communications channels.

The Dedicated Dispatcher and Communications Manager may be located at/near the scene in a mobile communications vehicle, or at a nearby fire station.

Frequency Assignments

Dispatch channels shall be used only for tones and directions: no operations shall be conducted on the Dispatch channel

A dedicated command channel shall be used of "command-to-dispatch" communications Each major sector shall be assigned a separate radio channel for sector use.

Command shall use a separate tactical frequency for all "sector-to-command" and "sector-to-sector" communications

Command shall have TWO radios - one for communicating with subordinate sector officers, and one for communicating to Dispatch

Sector officers shall have TWO radios – one for communicating with subordinate officers, and one for communicating to Command (or Operations) and other sector officers

Personnel with two radios should have an aide to assist in managing their communications

Available frequencies: Expected use

Dispatch: toning of units, guiding units to scene Command: Incident command to Dispatch Tactical frequencies: major operational sectors Coordination: dispatch-to-dispatch, coordinators

Cellular phones: detailed and/or confidential information

Radio Discipline

Per NIMS, plain language shall be used. Respect "urgent" and "mayday" messages

Keep all radio traffic to an absolute minimum; don't add to the confusion
